INDUCTION AND PROGRESSION

Meet and Greet: New students are welcomed and introduced to the school.

Entry Test

Each student takes a level test on arrival and is also given a speaking assessment, which allows our academic staff to assess the student's level of English and place him/her in the appropriate class.

Welcome Pack

Every student receives a welcome pack, which includes:

- * A DCI Student Handbook
- * Maps
- * Information about Dublin and Ireland
- * Needs Analysis Test

Testing

Students are tested at the end of every two-week period and teachers monitor progress on a daily basis. We conduct mid-course Needs Analysis Assessments to provide feedback and to allow any necessary changes to the syllabus. There is an Exit Test and all students will be awarded a school certificate on successful completion of the course.

Module 1- The first class tends to be book-work focused with emphasis on grammar, vocabulary and developing the four main skills – Speaking, Writing, Reading, and Listening.

Module 2- Provides students with the opportunity to improve their confidence and enthusiasm through participation in free-practice activities, projects, task-based learning and cultural discussions.

Module 3- These lessons focus on specific language skill areas such as: pronunciation, functional language, writing skills, register, cultural context, learning strategies and more.

Module 4- Elective Modules These specialist programmes allow students to focus on key areas of English.

- A. Exam Preparation: Students can prepare for major English exams including IELTS, Cambridge and TIE.
- Conversation Classes: These classes develop students' spoken fluency through debate, discussion and presentations.
- c. Business English: Business classes help students engage with the fundamentals of effective English business communication.

Exact availability of each of these Elective Classes may depend on availability.)

CLASSES AT DCI

Classes generally start on a Monday and you will have different teachers for different modules. Teaching hours are tuition hours of 60 minutes in the morning and 55 minutes in the afternoon. The maximum number of students per class is 15 with an average of 11-12 students per lesson as this allows each student to get the attention they require.

GE30 – GENERAL ENGLISH SUPER INTENSIVE

Our aim is to support students in improving their English inside and outside of class. Students keep



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STUDENT SERVICES

Our Student Services Team is available to help students deal with any difficulties they may have. This can range from providing practical advice about the city or simply spending time chatting in English. A 24-hour emergency telephone number is provided to all students for any serious issues.

HOST FAMILIES ACCOMMODATION

DCI is able to offer its participating students Host Family accommodation in and around Dublin's city centre due to an established network of welcoming families. Our registered host families are carefully selected for the programme by our Accommodation Officer.

HOTEL/HOSTEL ACCOMMODATION

There are a range of hotels, hostels and Bed & Breakfasts available throughout the year in Dublin as an alternative to homestay accommodations.

AIRPORT TRANSFERS

An airport transfer on arrival can be arranged for homestay accommodation. The cost is €90 (only available on arrival). Taxis are available outside the airport building.

MEDICAL INSURANCE

Medical Insurance: Medical Insurance can be arranged for approximately 110 per annum. Citizens of European Union countries should bring their European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) with them.

LEARNER PROTECTION

DCI provides students Learner Protection, through MEI, which is a collective arrangement where if an English language school was to close then another school would take in the affected students so they can complete their English language studies at no extra cost.

STUDENT VISAS

Citizens of certain countries must apply for a visa to study in Ireland. To apply for a Student Visa, students need:

- * A letter of confirmation from Dublin Cultural Institute as proof of acceptance
- A valid receipt showing that the course fees have been lodged to an approved student fees payment service
- Evidence that you have private medical insurance
- ★ Evidence that you have enough funds (€7,000) to maintain yourself for the initial part of your stay.

NEWTOWN SUMMER JUNIOR RESIDENTIAL SUMMER CAMP

Located within Waterford's medieval charm is Newtown, a private high school that offers international teens opportunities to improve their English in a summer camp environment. This is a small residential camp with a mix of nationalities that's focused on small groups and individuals, allowing personal attention to be given for each student.
